

Dear Mr. DeSchryver,

Thank you for your January 28, 2021 letter providing Good Samaritan Hospital's commitment to administer COVID-19 vaccines in accordance with State guidance and proposed actions.

Given Good Samaritan's intent to suspend its community clinic operations except for administration of second vaccine doses, to ensure efficient and effective administration of Good Samaritan's remaining vaccines, please also do the following:

- Administer second doses of vaccines to all individuals who received a first vaccine dose from Good Samaritan, including any individuals who were not part of Phase 1A but who received a first vaccine dose from Good Samaritan.
- Contact all such individuals to notify them that they should receive their second vaccine dose from Good Samaritan. Multiple individuals who received their first vaccine dose from Good Samaritan unfortunately appear to be confused as to who will administer their second vaccine doses and have contacted the County stating they have been informed they need to obtain their second dose from the County vaccination sites.
- As soon as possible, return any remaining first vaccine dose inventory to the County for efficient redistribution to other vaccination providers. If any additional health care workers at Good Samaritan request vaccination, they may be directed to county operated sites.
